This report (version 2) captures all the issues raised by stakeholders during the announcement phase of the Basic Assessment and Water Use Licence application for the proposed upgrade of an existing low-level bridge crossing the Braamhoekspruit. As part of the announcement a Background Information Document (BID) with a comment/registration sheet was distributed, an advertisement was placed in various newspapers during August 2008 and site notices were put up in the area of the proposed development. A Focus Group Meeting was held on 15 August 2008 with stakeholders living adjacent to the proposed development. A second advertisement was placed in September 2008 to announce the Draft Basic Assessment report. A public meeting was held on 23 September 2008 in the Agricultural Hall at Besters to announce the Draft Basic Assessment Report and comments from this meeting have also been included.

This report will be updated as the Basic Assessment process unfolds. A copy of this report will be distributed to everyone who attended the public meeting on 23 September 2008 and it will be appended to the Final Basic Assessment Reports that will be submitted to the decision-making authority, the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism.

Written and oral submissions from stakeholders are summarised in this report – the full versions of the submissions will also be appended to the Final Basic Assessment Report.

The issues raised will be categorised as the process unfolds.
