In reply to the various requests received by the applicable interested and affected parties pertaining to the above-mentioned project, the appointed environmental consultant would like to inform all such parties on behalf of Eskom of the following:

- Eskom has agreed that, where landowners that will be affected by the abovementioned project through receiving the 400kV power lines onto their land and there are already existing lines, no further Eskom Transmission power lines will be placed on the land in question unless under the conditions given in the attached letter.
- That the landowner in question may undertake site clearing on his/her own land for the construction of the proposed lines and will be reimbursed by Eskom for reasonable costs.
- That the landowner in question manages the vegetation within the servitude as per the agreement with Eskom and will be reimbursed by Eskom for reasonable costs.

The above may influence your comment on the environmental impact report currently out for public review, therefore all Interested and Affected Parties are hereby informed of the above and afforded a further period ending on **Monday 10 September 2007** for raising their comments, concerns, issues or grievances regarding the proposed project and finally commenting on the draft environmental impact report to the consultants, considering the above indication.

THE CONSTRUCTION OF TRANSMISSION LINES IN THE FUTURE

We refer to the above matter.

Introduction

According to the information furnished to us by Morgen Industrial Services, the EIA consultant, the landowners affected by the construction of the Medupi -Marang (1x 400kV) and the Medupi- Dinaledi (2x 400 kV) power lines requested information regarding the Eskom Transmission plans regarding future lines in the area.

Land owner issues

The landowners specifically wish to ascertain:

- whether the proposed six 765 kV power lines will be placed next to the abovementioned 400kV power lines; and
- that Eskom will give the assurance to all the land owners who presently have two Transmission lines on their properties and who will (after the addition of the three 400 kV power lines) have five Transmission lines on their property that hereafter Eskom will not require any additional transmission line servitudes on their properties.

The future transmission power lines

We advise that Transmission Planning will take cognisance of this in its future planning and every reasonable effort will be made to ensure that there are no additional Transmission power lines constructed on the affected properties.

We however assure all the affected land owners that should there be a need for additional power lines on their properties and if such lines adversely affect the land-use of the property, Eskom will give each land owner the choice of either purchasing the property at market related prices or alternatively entering negotiations for additional servitude rights.


This assurance however will not apply to any Distribution power lines, or, to the area situated closer to the Medupi and Matimba power stations as well as all the related Transmission sub-stations, due to the convergence of the power lines at these points.

Maintenance of the servitude

Eskom agrees in principle that the land owners maintain the servitudes on their respective properties. The land owners will be given the opportunity to clear the servitude for construction and thereafter to carry out vegetation maintenance of the servitude. Payment in respect hereof shall be based on the commercial rates presently paid to the contractors. The Eskom Transmission Regional Line and Servitude section will enter into individual agreements with the land owners regarding the maintenance of the servitude.

We trust that we have adequately addressed the concerns raised by the land owners.
