Easy ways to spot if your child/ family member or friend is using drugs:

- People using TIK are hyper-active
- TIK suppresses their appetite and causes insomnia
 A rapid loss in weight
 Dilated pupils and rapid or delayed reactions and speech
- If the person no longer interacts with the family, he or she becomes withdrawn When items start going missing in the house, they usually sell these items for drugs
