There are existing and planned specialized game breading farms. This is not mentioned as a land use and must be taken into account in the EIA. The specialist studies indicated for the EIA includes agricultural potential studies, but wildlife ranching and game farming required a separate specialist study and this does not fall within the context of agricultural potential. There is a requirement for a full economic assessment on all the corridors as to which corridor will have the biggest negative economic impact (cost) and which will add the greatest economic advantages? No clear indication of the existing tourist activities, including overnight and eco /hunting accommodation (Camps), within the area are indicated in the report. The impact of the power lines on hunting and eco-tourism activities must be investigated, not only when construction is finalized but also during construction. No construction, for obvious reasons, can take place in the hunting season which is April to October each year. This must also be taken onto account with maintenance of the line as no maintenance can take place in the hunting season. The decrease in value of the land as well as the threat to the existence and value of the entities operating as running concerns regarding these types of activities are in the light of the above mentioned points also of grave concern to all involved from landowners and investors to farm workers etc. This is regarding current and planned future activities of the nature as mentioned above.
