Justification, Need and Project Description:

South Africa has been experiencing growth in excess of 4% per annum over the past seven years, which led to the increase in electricity demand far exceeding the 2.3% per annum which was initially forecast. In 2007 alone, electricity demand grew by 4.9%, and it is forecast to grow even faster as the economy approaches the Government's target of 6% sustainable economic growth by 2014.

According to the ASGISA Electricity Load Forecast for 2008-2017, the KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) demand growth is estimated at 4.4% per annum. Accordingly, the Eskom Transmission Development Plan (TDP) indicates that the power corridor to the Eastern and South Coast Regions needs to be strengthened in order for Eskom Transmission to meet future growth in electricity demand in KZN, to avoid load shedding as a result of limited transmission capacity, and to comply with Grid Code Requirements. This strengthening entails the phased construction of 765 kV and 400 kV transmission lines into the Empangeni and Pinetown Customer Load Networks (CLN).

At present, only one 400 kV transmission line runs from the Arladne Sub-station, near Pietermaritzburg to the Eros Sub-station, near Harding. It is a Grid Code Requirement that the transmission network must be able to withstand loss of one of its lines or transformers, while still maintaining electricity supply. This means that a second transmission line between these two sub-stations is required. Furthermore, Preliminary Master Plan studies conducted by Eskom Distribution indicate that the load on the Eros Sub-station is expected to increase from 250 MVA in 2008 to 300 MVA in 2010 and upwards to approximately 450 MVA in 2022. An additional load of 250 MVA by 2022 is forecast for the Oribi Sub-station, near Port Shepstone, which also indicates a need for a 400 kV injection to this sub-station.

In order to address the above, the strengthening of the KZN transmission line network is proposed. This means that increased electricity transmission infrastructure is required to transmit increased electricity volumes from the generation centres in Mpumalanga, into KZN. This entails a number of different components, which have been divided into five sections:

- Section 1: Two 765 kV lines from the Alpha Sub-station, near the Thuthuka Power Station to the Majuba Sub-station, near Amersfoort, Mpumalanga, over a distance of approximately 50 km.
- Section 2: A 765 kV line from the Majuba Sub-station to the Venus Substation, near Estcourt, KZN, over a distance of approximately 200 km.
- Section 3: A 765 kV line continuing from the Venus Sub-station to a proposed new Sigma Sub-station, in the Albert Falls/Greytown area, KZN, over a distance of approximately 100 km.
- Section 4: A 400 kV double circuit transmission line from the proposed new Sigma Sub-station to the Hector Sub-station, close to Cato Ridge, A second part of this section includes a new 400 kV conductor installed on the existing Arladne-Hector 400 kV double circuit line, which currently has one vacant circuit.
- Section 5: A 400 kV line from the Arladne Sub-station, near Pietermaritishing to the Eros Sub-station near Harding, KZN, over a distance of approximately 117 km or 178 km, depending on the route followed (inland and coastal routes are under consideration).

There are two route options for Section 5, an in-land Route and a Coastal Route, Two separate applications are being submitted for these two routes. Regardless of the route alignment followed, extension of the Arladne sub-station will be required in order to accommodate the new line. This application is, thus, for the extension of the Arladne sub-station.


