AMENDMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION ISSUED ON 12 SEPTEMBER 2014 (AS AMENDED) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PORT ELIZABETH SUBSTATION, THE UPGRADE OF THE EXISTING GRASSRIDGE AND DEDISA SUBSTATION AND 2X 400KV TRANSMISSION POWER LINES FROM THE PORT ELIZABETH SUBSTATION TO GRASSRIDGE AND DEDISA SUBSTATION, NELSON MANDELA BAY METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITY, EASTERN CAPE PROVINCE.

The Environmental Authorisation (EA) issued for the above-mentioned application on 12 September 2014, the EA amendment dated 30 April 2015, the application form for amendment of an EA received by the Department on 23 August 2019, the amended application form and additional information for amendment of an EA received by the Department on 06 September 2019, refer.

Based on a review of the reason for requesting an amendment to the above EA, this Department, in terms of Chapter 5 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014, as amended, has decided to amend the EA as follows:

Amendment 1: Amendment relate to the extension of commencement of the construction period of the EA by an additional Five (05) years from 12 September 2019 to 12 September 2024.

Condition 6 of the EA dated 12 September 2014 (as amended), is thus amended as follows:

"The activity must commence within a period of ten (10) years from the date of issue of this authorisation (i.e. the authorisation lapses on 12 September 2024). If commencement of the activity does not occur within that period, the authorisation lapses and a new application for environmental authorisation must be made in order for the activity to be undertaken".

Reason for amendment:

The applicant, Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd requires an extension of the commencement period of the EA dated 12 September 2014, as amended, due to financial constraints and in discussions with the surrounding Independent Power Producers (IPPs) regarding their integration into the National Grid. Therefore the project is required to connect the surrounding IPPs and to feed or integrate into the National Grid Network.

This letter must be read in conjunction with the EA dated 12 September 2014, as amended.

Kindly note that no further request for extension of this EA will be accepted in future. The Department is aware that the environment changes constantly, as a result conditions may be significantly different from the ones that existed at the time of the issuing of this EA, hence the validity of the EA cannot exceed a maximum period of 10 years. As such, failure to commence with construction activities on or before 19 June 2024 will result in the exhaustion of the maximum 10-year period that is a standard for the Department in terms of validity periods for all EAs. Should you not commence with the authorised listed activities within the above stipulated period, your EA will be deemed to have lapsed and a new application for environmental authorisation will have to be lodged

In terms of Regulation 4(2) of the National Environmental Management Act: the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014, as amended (the EIA Regulations), you are instructed to notify all registered interested and affected parties, in writing within 14 (fourteen) days of the date of this EA, of the Department's decision as well as the provisions regarding the submission of appeals that are contained in the Regulations.

In terms of the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000 (Act No 3 of 2000), you are entitled to the right to fair, lawful and reasonable administrative action; and to written reasons for administrative action that affects you negatively. Further your attention is drawn to the provisions of the Protection of Personal Information Act, 2013 (Act no. 4 of 2013) which stipulate that the Department should conduct itself in a responsible manner when collecting, processing, storing and sharing an individual or another entity's personal information by holding the Department accountable should the Department abuse or compromise your personal information in any way.

Your attention is further drawn to Chapter 2 of National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) National Appeal Regulations published under Government Notice R993 in Government Gazette No. 38303 dated 08 December 2014 (National Appeal Regulations, 2014), which prescribe the appeal procedure to be followed. Kindly include a copy of this document (National Appeal Regulations, 2014) with the letter of notification to interested and affected parties in this matter.

Should any person wish to lodge an appeal against this decision, he/she must submit the appeal to the appeal administrator, and a copy of the appeal to the applicant, any registered interested and affected party, and any organ of state with interest in the matter within 20 days from the date that the notification of the decision was sent to the registered interested and affected parties by the applicant; or the date that the notification of the decision was sent to the applicant by the Department, whichever is applicable.
