2. OBJECTIVES OF THE MEETING

The primary objectives of this meeting were as follows:

For the project team to:

- Present the main findings of the Scoping Process.
- Explain the next steps in the EIA Process.

For the stakeholders to:

- Verify that issues/concerns are captured in the Draft Scoping Reports.
- Comment on the findings of the Draft Scoping Reports.

3. EIA PROCESSES

The Facilitator explained the specific EIA processes for the two projects.

For the **Transmission Power Line and Substation Integration EIAs**, a pre-feasibility study was conducted, and after consultation with the National Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEAT) and KwaZulu-Natal Department of Agriculture and Environmental Affairs (DAEA), it was decided that a detailed scoping study would be conducted. It is thus anticipated that a Record of Decision for the project would be issued after the Scoping Phase.

For the **Construction and Upgrade of Access Roads EIA**, the project will progress into the Impact Assessment Phase after Scoping. Consultation with DEAT, KZN DAEA and Free State Department of Tourism, Environment and Economic Affairs (FS DTEEA). It is thus anticipated that a Record of Decision for the project would be issued after the Impact Assessment Phase.

It was further noted that, up until now, the two processes have been running one Public Participation Process.

The summary of the information presented is provided in Appendix 4. The issues raised and discussed following the Facilitator's presentation are summarised in Appendices 1-3.

4. TRANSMISSION POWER LINE AND SUB-STATION INTEGRATION EIAs: MAIN FINDINGS OF THE DRAFT SCOPING REPORTS

Mr Beston Silungwe Propnet	Please outline the timeframes for the entire project.	Frans Louwinger. In terms of timeframes for the Braamhoek Pumped Storage Scheme and its components, it is anticipated that construction of the roads will commence during 2006, construction of the scheme will commence in 2007 and construction of the power lines will commence in 2009. It is anticipated that commissioning will occur in 2012.
Mr William Thulezwani Dlamini Community Environmental Workers Trust (CEWT)	In the Thukela District Municipality there are 5 local municipalities and about 100 CEWT groups. This organisation consists of volunteers that teach communities about maintaining a clean and safe environment. CEW organisations also promote HIV/AIDS awareness. Please call me on 0837393660 if Eskom can assist us or use this in any way.	Noted.
Mr Bruce Acutt Department of Transport KZN	The Department of Transport requested that we make use of the Vukuzakhe Programme to unpack the construction contracts to allow for different levels of companies to get involved in the project. The EIA Consultants are aware of the Programme. This programme will be beneficial to the local community and provide for skills development.	Noted.

Mr Beston Silungwe Propnet	<p>Has the EIA process identified the various surrounding landowners in the study area, and have you engaged with them? Does Eskom need to buy the land or go through a process of expropriation?</p> <p>What are the anticipated timeframes for this project?</p>	<p>Stuart Dunsmore. We have been through a detailed process of identifying landowners on all the proposed power line routes and we have identified and consulted with most of these people. They are, therefore, aware of the project and have mainly participated through the Farmers Associations. After the EIA process, Eskom will enter into negotiations with affected landowners to negotiate the servitude on a one-to-one basis.</p> <p>In terms of timeframes for this EIA, the Final Scoping Report will be submitted to the authorities within the next week or so, so this is essentially the last public engagement. The Authorities will then issue a Record of Decision, the details of which will be communicated to all Interested and Affected Parties.</p>
Mr Ken Gordon WESSA	<p>It is important to note that the entire study area is an important habitat for birds, not just the escarpment. The wattle crane, blue crane and crowned crane are abundant in the area and move around, especially in winter. It, therefore, does not make a big difference where the transmission line runs, as birds will be affected everywhere.</p>	<p>Noted.</p>

Stakeholder	Comment	Response
Mr Syd Knowles Propnet (Spoornet)	Have you compiled a list of property owners in the study area? We are running a separate process with Eskom where we deal with specific aspects of design.	Stuart Dunsmore. The public participation process has identified as many landowners as possible. The Scoping Report has a data base which contains a list of landowners who have participated. However, this does not mean that they are necessarily "affected" landowners. It could be worthwhile if we distribute a list of affected landowners to everyone on the database.
Mr Maxwell Shabalala Matiwaneskop Landowners	When will the public be informed as to the selected route of the transmission power line? I would like to participate in the process but specifically focussing on the preferred route.	Karin Bowler. It would be beneficial if you could participate in the process now so that you can assist the EIA Consultant to identify the best route. It makes more sense to do this rather than to only provide input once the route has been selected. Please provide comment now so that your preference can be submitted to the Authorities. Stuart Dunsmore. We have identified a preferred route that we are recommending to the Authorities and Eskom. The route is the western line, and has been recommended for a number of environmental reasons.
Mr Ed Bunge Eskom Distribution	Eskom Distribution has been approached by Eskom Generation to install a distribution line in the area. The line will run parallel to your line and will require a substation. Have these issues been included in the EIA?	Stuart Dunsmore. This will have to be discussed further with Eskom Generation and Eskom Transmission. This hasn't been included in this EIA and will need a separate EIA.
Mr Themba Ndlovu CEWT – Weenen Area	Have any impacts specific to the Colenso and Weenen areas been taken into account? It seems that the focus has been around the Ladysmith area.	Stuart Dunsmore. The EIA considered all possible impacts and definitely looked at impacts on those areas, specifically the eco-tourism potential. We have had meetings with various community groups, Farmers Associations and Traditional Authorities. Once we identified the preferred route with fewer negative impacts, we did focus on that, i.e. the western route.
Ms Angela Ngoato Eskom Development Foundation	We would like some assurance that you have consulted with local communities on job creation and social benefits. If people have the necessary technical qualifications, will they be considered for employment?	Stuart Dunsmore. Our team has advised stakeholders that jobs with transmission power line construction are limited. This is because of the specialist nature of construction activities required. However, there are various indirect job opportunities that will be created and we recommend that Eskom and local municipalities identify these sectors now. We cannot raise any expectations with this project. Karin Bowler. The most the EIA consultant can do is make to recommendations. This is an Eskom issue.

Stakeholder	Comment	Response
Mr Ken Gordon Wildlife and Environment Society of SA	What impacts will there be on watercourses in the area? This could be a serious issue.	Stuart Dunsmore. There is expected to be minimal impact on watercourses in terms of the substation. The substation footprint is relatively small in relation to the catchment, and the design of substation drainage systems is quite advanced and should be suitable for pollution control from the Braamhoek Substation. There are other water related issues associated with the Braamhoek PSS, and these are the subject of water licence applications to the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry (DWAF). A separate meeting is being held after this meeting to address the water licence issues.

Mr Ken Gordon WESSA	I am concerned about the new N3 De Beers Pass to be constructed in the future. Has this been taken into consideration during your EIAs?	Jaana-Maria Ball. Yes, the new N3 has definitely been considered in the studies conducted. Also, we have had discussions with the N3TC, SANRAL and Provincial Roads Departments. We have future meetings scheduled with these organisations to discuss the matter further. Notably, the projects are running with different timeframes.
Mr Bruce Aitken Eskom	You mentioned that there would be an impact on the Wilge River and that a bridge would need to be upgraded. Please elaborate.	Jaana-Maria Ball. The impact would occur if Alternative 1 of the external access roads were to be constructed. This is the preferred option. The bridge would need to be widened and specialists would consider this and recommend specific construction methods and mitigating measures.
Mr Ken Gordon WESSA	Have you considered the possibility of the Jaana Dam being constructed (as part of the Thukela Water Project)? This would have a direct impact on your impacts regarding water.	Jaana-Maria Ball. The Department of Water Affairs and Forestry (DWAF) is one of our key stakeholders in this project so we have been in close consultation with them since project inception. Also, we have currently been conducting the water use licensing process in close consultation with the Provincial and National Departments of DWAF.
Mrs Joyce Gumede KwaNalu Farmers Association	Have you considered the Driefontein Road? This road runs through many farms in the area.	Karin Bowler. It was suggested that Mrs Gumede meets with Mr Dave Montgomery for detailed information, as clarity on the road referred to was required.

Stakeholder	Comment	Response
Mr Cas Human Landowner, Van Reenen	The Swinburne/Kiesbeen Road poses safety problems with a dangerous intersection. How will you ensure that contractor's trucks will use allocated roads and not the Van Reenen Road? Contractors will take the shortest route possible to save time and cost.	Jaana-Maria Ball. Eskom will instruct contractors within binding contract documents as to which routes they can use during construction. These conditions will be part of the contract and the stipulations could be written into an Environmental Management Plan (EMP). Eskom will monitor these conditions and an Environmental Control Officer will be appointed to monitor the EMP. Also, a Resident Engineer will be on site. Landowners are welcome to consult with any of these officials during construction. In our discussions with the N3TC, there are other safety issues along the Swinburne Road and it is important that all these issues are considered.
Ms Angela Ngoato Eskom Development Foundation	We would like some assurance that you have consulted with local communities on job creation and social benefits. If people have the necessary technical qualifications, will they be considered for employment?	Jaana-Maria Ball. We have consulted with the community as well as the Emnambithi/Ladysmith Local Municipality and the Harrismith municipalities. The issue of job creation has been discussed. We have done preliminary calculations on the numbers and types of jobs that will be created as part of this project. Also, at the previous public meeting, Eskom undertook to commence with the registration of local companies onto their procurement database. Karin Bowler. The most the EIA consultant can do is to make recommendations. This is an Eskom issue.
Mr Ken Gordon WESSA	What impact will there be on watercourses in the area? This could be a serious issue.	Linda Munro. In terms of the scheme itself, the largest impact on water would be on flow regime of rivers. Specialist studies have been undertaken on hydrological aspects. We are currently compiling the Integrated Water Use Licence Application Document which will include these specialist study reports. Also, an EIA was conducted for the scheme in 1999 where various aspects, including water impacts, were investigated.
