PROJECT MOTIVATION

Eskom Holdings (SOC) Ltd (hereafter referred to as —Eskomll) is submitting an application to the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) for the proposed development of a 132kV power line from the existing Taunus substation to the existing Diepkloof substation and two new substations. Both the proposed substations will be located within the boundaries of the West Rand District Municipality on Farm Zuurbekom 297 IQ and are proposed to have a capacity of 132kV. The length of the power line will be approximately 40 km and the footprint of both the proposed substations will be 100 m x 100 m (1 hectare). The proposed project will be located south of Soweto in within the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan and another portion within the Westonaria Local Municipality which are both located in Gauteng Province.

The objective of the project is to reduce the network constraints as well as to improve the quality of supply in the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality and the West Rand District Municipality .It is envisaged that the proposed line and substations will reinforce the supply and improve supply reliability to all existing and future customers in the area.

A request for future energy supply has prompted Eskom to evaluate their infrastructure in the area and look at alternatives to meet future energy demand in the area. The proposed project aims to strengthen the network capacity as well as to improve the quality of supply in the area. High energy demand activities e.g. mining are prominent in the area. Currently a large amount of pressure is placed on the existing substations and it is unlikely that it have the capacity to

meet future demands.

The existing 88kV and 132kV networks are unable to cater for future load growth in the area. The existing network that supply the Johannesburg South areas are becoming overloaded following the increasing pressure from residential and commercial development. Therefore a new MVA source (20MVA load) is required in the vicinity of the RWB Zuurbekom just south of the N12, another new MVA 11 kV source required adjacent to Pimville in order to remove existing load capacity from Moroka. In order to improve reliability, a backup supply is also required for the new Calcined Products substation. These proposed developments in Soweto will connect Taunus with new source, support existing networks by deloading lines currently strained, will make available bulk capacity on the south side of Soweto and will further make Soweto competitive for development.

Local benefits of the proposed development include benefits to the local economy through job creation in the construction phase as well as during the operational phase of the development. The construction for the proposed powerline is estimated to last for approximately two years and further estimate about six weeks per kilometre construction time. During the construction phase of the development, local labour (where applicable) will be sourced and where possible socially responsible local service providers will be used in order to benefit the maximum amount of people.

Presentation of the proposed development by TS

TS - Eskom is proposing the development of a 132kV power line from the existing Taunus substation to the existing Diepkloof substation and two new substations within both the Westonaria Local Municipality and City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality, Gauteng Province.

- Cllr WD We are aware of this proposed development as we have received your draft basic
 assessment report. We have no issues regarding this project and it is welcome because it will
 help in increasing the reliability of electricity in the area.
- TS Yes, this project will indeed assist in increasing the supply of electricity in the area.
- JD This will help because so many property owners around the community are renting out shacks within their yards and this is definitely increasing electricity demand.
- TS Will there be a need for a further public meeting for this project?
- CIIr WD No, perhaps only towards the beginning of construction.
- Clir WD However we require that our local community be provided with employment opportunities during construction.
- SB Will this proposed power line be vulnerable to cable theft, as we already have similar problems in our area?
 - TS A reminder that We, as Envirolution have been appointed by Eskom to be

environmental consultants for this project and cannot really comment in terms of Eskom installing prepaid meters for you.
 CONCLUSION AND WAY FORWARD
Councillor Willie Dihamini concluded by saying that this project is welcome and they have no issues against the development as it will increase electricity supply.
TS informed all the attendees that they welcome to submit comments and concerns about the basic assessment report and project.

PROJECT MOTIVATION

Eskom Holdings (SOC) Ltd (hereafter referred to as —Eskomll) is submitting an application to the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) for the proposed development of a 132kV power line from the existing Taunus substation to the existing Diepkloof substation and two new substations. Both the proposed substations will be located within the boundaries of the West Rand District Municipality on Farm Zuurbekom 297 IQ and are proposed to have a capacity of 132kV. The length of the power line will be approximately 40 km and the footprint of both the proposed substations will be 100 m x 100 m (1 hectare). The proposed project will be located south of Soweto in within the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan and another portion within the Westonaria Local Municipality which are both located in Gauteng Province.

The objective of the project is to reduce the network constraints as well as to improve the quality of supply in the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality and the West Rand District Municipality .It is envisaged that the proposed line and substations will reinforce the supply and improve supply reliability to all existing and future customers in the area.

A request for future energy supply has prompted Eskom to evaluate their infrastructure in the area and look at alternatives to meet future energy demand in the area. The proposed project aims to strengthen the network capacity as well as to improve the quality of supply in the area.

Presentation of the proposed development by TS

TS - Eskom is proposing the development of a 132kV power line from the existing Taunus substation to the existing Diepkloof substation and two new substations within both the Westonaria Local Municipality and City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality, Gauteng Province.

- CIIr GK Yes, this project is good for the area as it will provide better electricity stability, however we demand that our local labour be utilized during the construction phase to conduct manual labour although we aware that our locals are not experts and specialist but they are able to do the less skilled functions.
- TS A motivation has been included in the draft basic assessment report to recruit local labour for this project. However please be aware that most likely the Westonaria Ward 17 local labour will be recruited only on sections traversing the Westonaria ward 17 and not the entire project.
- . CIIr GK Yes we are aware of that.
- SB Will this proposed power line be vulnerable to cable theft, as we already have similar problems in our area?

TS – Not likely, the proposed power line is a 132 kV in capacity and will be large in size and also too high for common cable thieves.

- SB Can Eskom please inform the community when construction is due to commence?
 - TS We will recommend that Eskom inform the community before construction begins.
- MS We welcome this project as long as the local community members are provided an
 opportunity to be employed during construction.
- SB We request that our municipality must not be confused with the City of Joburg
 Municipality when the project reaches our jurisdiction. We don't want City of Joburg labour
 working in our municipality ward when the time comes.
- TS I'm sure Eskom is aware of the jurisdiction of the different municipalities.
- **SB** In the past we have requested that Eskom install prepaid electricity for us, however nothing has happened in that regard to date.
- TS A reminder that We, as Envirolution have been appointed by Eskom to be environmental
 consultants for this project and cannot really comment in terms of Eskom installing prepaid
 meters for you.

CONCLUSION AND WAY FORWARD

Councillor Gladys Khoza informed TS that further discussions will be held within the ward committee and community and will inform TS if another public meeting is necessary.

TS informed all the attendees that they welcome to submit comments and concerns about the basic assessment report and project. TS also proceeded to hand out business cards to all attendees.
