ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION IN TERMS OF THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ACT, 1998: GN R.543, 544 AND 546: CONSTRUCTION OF THE GALATYENI SUBSTATION AND 132kV LOOP IN/OUT OVERHEAD POWER LINES WITHIN MBIZANA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY IN THE EASTERN CAPE PROVINCE

With reference to the above application, please be advised that the Department has decided to grant authorisation. The environmental authorisation (EA) and reasons for the decision are attached herewith.

The establishment of a new 132/22kV substation of approximately 13  $000m^2$  in size and will include 132/22kV 2x20 MVA transformers and 8X22kV reticulation feeders. 22kV HARE turn-in lines will also be erected to connect the proposed Galatyeni Substation to the existing 22kV network. A 132kV Kingbird line, which double loops in/out is to be erected from the L-Sipakweni 132kV line to the proposed Galatyeni Substation. The overhead distribution line will be  $\pm$  1.7 to 2km in length with a servitude width of 32m.

#### Conditions of this Environmental Authorisation

#### Scope of authorisation

- 1. The preferred Alternative 1 Galatyeni Substation and its associated power line (Alternative 1) for the abovementioned project is approved.
- 2. Authorisation of the activity is subject to the conditions contained in this authorisation, which form part of the environmental authorisation and are binding on the holder of the authorisation.
- 3. The holder of the authorisation is responsible for ensuring compliance with the conditions contained in this environmental authorisation. This includes any person acting on the holder's behalf, including but not limited to, an agent, servant, contractor, sub-contractor, employee, consultant or person rendering a service to the holder of the authorisation.
- 4. The activities authorised must only be carried out at the property as described above.
- 5. Any changes to, or deviations from, the project description set out in this authorisation must be approved, in writing, by the Department before such changes or deviations may be effected. In assessing whether to grant such approval or not, the Department may request such information as it deems necessary to evaluate the significance and impacts of such changes or deviations and it may be necessary for the holder of the authorisation to apply for further authorisation in terms of the regulations.
- 6. This activity must commence within a period of five (5) years from the date of issue of this authorisation. If commencement of the activity does not occur within that period, the authorisation lapses and a new application for environmental authorisation must be made in order for the activity to be undertaken.
- 7. Commencement with one activity listed in terms of this authorisation constitutes commencement of all authorised activities.
- 8. The holder of an environmental authorisation must notify the competent authority of any alienation, transfer and change of ownership rights in the property on which the activity is to take place.

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#### Notification of authorisation and right to appeal

- The holder of the authorisation must notify every registered interested and affected party, in writing and within 12 (twelve) calendar days of the date of this environmental authorisation, of the decision to authorise the activity.
- 10. The notification referred to must -
  - 10.1. specify the date on which the authorisation was issued;
  - 10.2. inform the interested and affected party of the appeal procedure provided for in Chapter 7 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2010;
  - 10.3. advise the interested and affected party that a copy of the authorisation will be furnished on request; and
  - 10.4. give the reasons of the competent authority for the decision.
- 11. The holder of the authorisation must publish a notice -
  - 11.1. informing interested and affected parties of the decision;
  - 11.2. informing interested and affected parties where the decision can be accessed; and
  - 11.3. drawing the attention of interested and affected parties to the fact that an appeal may be lodged against this decision in the newspaper(s) contemplated and used in terms of regulation 54(2)(c) and (d) and which newspaper was used for the placing of advertisements as part of the public participation process.

#### Management of the activity

12. The Environmental Management Programme (EMPr) submitted as part of the Application for EA is hereby approved. This EMPr must be implemented and adhered to. All mitigation measures as proposed in the EMPr must be implemented.

#### Monitoring

13. The applicant must appoint a suitably experienced independent Environmental Control Officer (ECO) for the construction phase of the development that will have the responsibility to ensure that the mitigation/rehabilitation measures and recommendations referred to in this authorisation are implemented and to ensure compliance with the provisions of the EMPr.

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- 13.1. The ECO must be appointed before commencement of any authorised activities.
- 13.2. Once appointed, the name and contact details of the ECO must be submitted to the *Director:*Compliance Monitoring of the Department.
- 13.3. The ECO must keep record of all activities on site, problems identified, transgressions noted and a task schedule of tasks undertaken by the ECO.
- 13.4. The ECO must remain employed until all rehabilitation measures, as required for implementation due to construction damage, are completed and the site is ready for operation.
- 13.5. Records relating to monitoring and auditing must be kept on site and made available for inspection to any relevant and competent authority in respect of this development.

#### Recording and reporting to the Department

- 14. All documentation e.g. audit/monitoring/compliance reports and notifications, required to be submitted to the Department in terms of this authorisation, must be submitted to the *Director: Compliance Monitoring* at the Department.
- 15. The holder of the authorisation must submit an environmental audit report to the Department within 30 days of completion of the construction phase (i.e. within 30 days of site handover) and within 30 days of completion of rehabilitation activities.
- 16. The environmental audit report must indicate the date of the audit, the name of the auditor and the outcome of the audit in terms of compliance with the environmental authorisation conditions as well as the requirements of the EMPr.

#### Commencement of the activity

- 17. The authorised activity must not commence within twenty (20) days of the date of signature of the authorisation.
- 18. In terms of Section 43(7), an appeal under Section 43 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 will suspend the environmental authorisation or any provision or condition attached thereto. In the instance where an appeal is lodged you may not commence with the activity until such time that the appeal has been finalised.

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Notification to authorities

19. Fourteen (14) days written notice must be given to the Department that the activity will commence.

Commencement for the purposes of this condition includes site preparation. The notice must include a

date on which it is anticipated that the activity will commence, as well as a reference number. This

notification period may coincide with the notice of intent to appeal period.

Operation of the activity

20. Fourteen (14) days written notice must be given to the Department that the activity operational phase will

commence.

Site closure and decommissioning

21. Should the activity ever cease or become redundant, the applicant shall undertake the required actions as

prescribed by legislation at the time and comply with all relevant legal requirements administered by any

relevant and competent authority at that time.

Specific conditions

22. Should any historical, cultural, paleontological resources and graves being found in the course of

development of the proposed power line, all construction activities must be suspended and SAHRA must

be contacted immediately so that the find can be investigated and mitigation measures proposed.

23. No open fires will be allowed on site during the construction phase of the project.

24. An integrated waste management approach must be implemented that is based on waste minimisation

and must incorporate reduction, recycling, re-use and disposal.

25. Any solid waste must be disposed of at a landfill licensed in terms of section 20 (b) of the National

Environment Management Waste Act, 2008 (Act 59 of 2008).

General

26. A copy of this authorisation and the approved EMPr must be kept at the property where the activity will be

undertaken. The authorisation and approved EMPr must be produced to any authorised official of the

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Department who requests to see it and must be made available for inspection by any employee or agent

of the holder of the authorisation who works or undertakes work at the property.

27. The holder of the authorisation must notify both the Director: Strategic Infrastructure Developments and the Director: Compliance Monitoring at the Department, in writing and within 48 (forty eight) hours, if any

condition of this authorisation cannot be or is not adhered to. Any notification in terms of this condition

must be accompanied by reasons for the non-compliance.

28. National government, provincial government, local authorities or committees appointed in terms of the

conditions of this authorisation or any other public authority shall not be held responsible for any damages

or losses suffered by the applicant or his successor in title in any instance where construction or operation

subsequent to construction be temporarily or permanently stopped for reasons of non-compliance by the

applicant with the conditions of authorisation as set out in this document or any other subsequent

document emanating from these conditions of authorisation.

#### **Annexure 1: Reasons for Decision**

#### 1. Information considered in making the decision

In reaching its decision, the Department took, inter alia, the following into consideration -

- a) The information contained in the amended BAR dated July 2015.
- b) Mitigation measures as proposed in the amended BAR dated July 2015 and the EMPr contained within Appendix G of the amended BAR.
- c) The information contained in the Palaeontological desktop assessment and Archaeological impact assessment contained within Appendix D of the amended BAR dated July 2015.
- d) Additional information received on 6 September 2015
- e) The objectives and requirements of relevant legislation, policies and guidelines, including section 2 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998).

#### 2. Key factors considered in making the decision

All information presented to the Department was taken into account in the Department's consideration of the application. A summary of the issues which, in the Department's view, were of the most significance is set out below.

- a) The findings of all the specialist studies conducted and their recommended mitigation measures.
- b) The need for proposed construction of Galatyeni substation and 132kV loop in/out power lines within Mbizana Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape Province.
- c) The amended BAR dated June 2015 identified all legislation and guidelines that have been considered in the preparation of the amended BAR dated June 2015.
- d) The finding of the site visit conducted on 4 June 2015.
- e) The methodology used in assessing the potential impacts identified in the amended BAR dated June 2015 and the specialist study have been adequately indicated.
- f) A sufficient public participation process was undertaken and the applicant has satisfied the minimum requirements as prescribed in the EIA Regulations, 2010 for public involvement.

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#### 3. Findings

After consideration of the information and factors listed above, the Department made the following findings -

- a) The identification and assessment of impacts are detailed in the amended BAR dated July 2015 and sufficient assessment of the key identified issues and impacts have been completed.
- b) The procedure followed for impact assessment is adequate for the decision-making process.
- c) The proposed mitigation of impacts identified and assessed adequately curtails the identified impacts.
- d) The information contained in the amended BAR dated July 2015 is accurate and credible.
- e) EMPr measures for the pre-construction, construction and rehabilitation phases of the development were proposed and included in the amended BAR and will be implemented to manage the identified environmental impacts during the construction process.

In view of the above, the Department is satisfied that, subject to compliance with the conditions contained in the environmental authorisation, the proposed activity will not conflict with the general objectives of integrated environmental management laid down in Chapter 5 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 and that any potentially detrimental environmental impacts resulting from the proposed activity can be mitigated to acceptable levels. The environmental authorisation is accordingly granted.
